For 50 years, the Val d'Or Indigenous Friendship Centre has spearheaded initiatives to improve the quality of life of Indigenous people living in or passing through Val-d'Or, to promote Indigenous culture, to advocate for the recognition and defence of Indigenous rights and interests, and to bring about reconciliation. Its action areas have changed considerably over the decades. Starting out as a gathering place, the Centre has become a major service hub, a cultural reference point for members of the urban Indigenous community, and a place of learning and intergenerational transmission.

"We are so proud to launch our 50th anniversary celebrations," says Sharon Hunter, chair of VDIFC's board of directors. "The logo reminds us how far we've come, but it is also looking to the future. We are honoured to celebrate these 50 years of accomplishments and to continue working in partnership with our allies toward justice and reconciliation."
